Educational Initiatives Bulgaria—John and Laura Campbell

Laura tutors older children in an orphanage in a neighboring city, while John mentors and encourages young orphan men in Sofia. They look forward to 2012 and becoming further involved in these young lives and looking for other avenues of ministry.

WWN exists for the purpose of providing education and solutions for female specific issues in Zimbabwe. Menstruation kits, which include undergarments and washable menstruation pads, have been distributed so that girls are able to stay in school during their cycle. Over 600 bras and 300 pillowcase dresses have been distributed to those in need. WWN has also begun to distribute GATE Scholarships which provide girls with tuition, school uniforms, and other needs. WWN has also provided \$65 micro finance loans to two women.

Holistic Peace and Development Zimbabwe—*Pastor Masango Matimura*

Masango Matimura, a Zimbabwean pastor, is the founding Director of Holistic Peace and Development-Zimbabwe (HPDZ). As a 2010-2011 Fulbright-Hubert H. Humphrey Fellow, he returned home in July 2011. In October, Masango launched a ground breaking ministry initiative in his home town of an initial one-day training session for 13 pastors took place with a focus on peacemaking and reconciliation. The event was enthusiastically received by the pastors who requested that more workshops of this nature continue, enabling them to train others.


A Note from the Office
