


GHI


- Yes, Global Horizons Inc. has seen another year of generous growth and is extending its reach.

GAM was officially inaugurated in Ghana during its first conference on July 26, 2012 at the Holy Spirit Cathedral, Cape Coast by Rev. Millicent Yeboah Asuamah. The Board Members express heartfelt gratitude to God for the possibility to organize important activities. Some of our important work included a conference for needy widows and pastors on the need to care of the disabled, widowed, and ill, and, for widows specifically, leadership training, meetings on the challenges of being a woman, and distribution of seeds donated by Hope Seed to start vegetable gardens. We say "Ayikoo" in Akan language, meaning "well-done"!

Dala Development Program

Dan Okall—Kenya

Dala Development Program is doing great. Through BEST program, we reached over 2,500 women and men, expanded our outreach, and started facilitating mammography screening. We also provided 43 kids with early childhood education, in partnership with a local church. This year, we raised and sent the most amount of money to Kenya, even though fundraising is still a challenge. Our staff members are catching the vision of discipleship and evangelism. We praise God.

A.L.E.R.T.

Kisongo Mbeleulu—Congo

African Leadership Empowerment, Reconciliation and Transformation (A.L.E.R.T.) trained a total of 175 church and community leaders on Servant Leadership, Peacemaking and Community Development in the Uvira and Bukavu areas (Democratic Republic of the Congo). Leaders are empowered to take ownership of transformation of their respective communities. For this purpose, a sustainable education of the leaders, as the influential insider agents, is required to make lasting and meaningful change. A tailoring project also has been launched in favor of poor women (victims of abuses and violence) in the Bukavu area to create a source of income.

Grace Community Development Agency

Silas Dauji—Nigeria

GCDA continues to partner with Life-water Canada to build wells and

washrooms in difficult to reach locations of Nigeria: Awaje, Sulemanuwa, and Yar Kasuwa. The dedication and gratitude of the peoples of these villages outweighs every obstacle the team faces in drilling these wells. In July, Binta and Lisa traveled from Fort Wayne, Indiana to Nigeria to join Silas and the staff of GCDA, in the office.

Mission: Moving Mountains

Sam Tsapwe—Uganda

M:MM Uganda focused on working with the Bukhalu community by creating awareness among the people about their own wholistic development. We also coached eight mission teams in Uganda, teaching them about whole life development. We were able to encourage many people by helping them recognize the potential development resources within their community. Another victory was the individual development of the 50 team members in the areas of health, family relationships, agriculture, income generation and spiritual life. We are grateful for support, yet our greatest challenge is inadequate funding.

Reach-Point

We are excited to see God move mightily. We work with three churches in the town of Hosanna, Ethiopia. We launched a sponsorship program for 300 children, partnering with Children's Hope Chest and our Church Hosanna, in Lakeville, MN. We held a three day program with the children, teaching about the love and friendship of Jesus. We are excited to see the changes in the community with the police officers, seminary students, women, and children, with whom we work. God is rebuilding and restoring so *they* can go and do the reaching.

Bob Osburn visited the 62 children (triple the enrollment of two years earlier) enrolled in Thangboi Haokip's Cornerstone Academy of Manipur. A question haunted Bob: *Without Cornerstone Academy in this miserably poor, violent corner of one of India's most forgotten and perilous states, what would happen to these children?* The answer is painful: Without the Christian education at Cornerstone Academy these children would have no education and would end up as prostitutes, violent insurgents, or as the poor and unemployed who barely scratch out a living.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he/she is a new creation the old has gone, the new has come." 2 Cor: 5:17

China Outreach

Once again Mel taught "At the Margin of Mystery: A Teaching on God & Creation" that included 15 students, a translator and others. The study of the Scriptures and contemporary science showed both disciplines are mutually consistent and complementary. 



Over the last year, Masango trained 265 interdenominational pastors, political and church youth in the towns of Mutare and Nyanga. He focused on the topics of conflict transformation and management skills, nonviolence, peace-building, and reconciliation from a Biblical perspective. Masango’s training empowered churches, community youth, and leaders to promote and practice nonviolence and reconciliation in a deeply divided Zimbabwe. 
