In a country that's mostly occupied by Roman Catholics, 500 Evangelical Christians might not seem like much. But, under the leadership of Pastor Mihal Kreko, this group is taking Croatia by storm and proving that small is powerful.

"Our size isn't a hindrance," Kreko says. "We are small like a mustard seed. We can bring massive change."

And they are.

With the help of GHI, Kreko is leading two missions. One, an Evangelical church in the capital city of Zagreb. When many countries were putting up barbed wire fences and forming armies to keep Syrian refugees out, Kreko's church and other Croatian organizations were reaching out with welcoming arms.

Kreko's second mission, Mosaic21, is a cultural center 15 years in the making. Kreko's vision of an integrated social services center is finally coming to fruition. .

"This will be a platform for different organizations, integrating all three sectors - civic, private and public," says Kreko. "A pillar for life-long learning, the center will provide education. With that comes the opportunity for citizens to change their vocation and better their lives."

Kreko plans to develop a fully-equipped team for relief work and development to help Syrians entering the country and looking for a new place to call home. He says, "I see this as a center for international friendship where different nations and cultures will be represented."
