Greetings to you all in Jesus' Name, trusting that the Lord has taken care of you well as He has done for us here in Juba, in the prevailing health situation in the whole world. Nothing like this that I know of has ever happened in our world. But our God is in control. Praise be to the Lord!

It is good to write to you again, after some time has gone by without you hearing from us. The last two weeks have not been good for us in the house. Tabita was not feeling good so I took her for checkup in a Health Center nearby. They found she had malaria and so prescribed some malaria tabs. When she took the medicine it did not go well with her. She developed rashes all over her body. Her tongue became swollen with rashes all over in the mouth. She could not eat or drink anything. I took her to the hospital and a doctor there prescribed some injections and medicine to be applied to the tongue and mouth. As I write now her tongue is better though there are some wounds on both sides. She can eat and drink a little and can talk. We had to bring our granddaughter Jemima to come and stay with us to help us in the house. Pray for her.

We are thankful to the Lord for the new Government here. They have removed the oppressive Islamic laws intended to persecute Christians and hinder their work. Freedom of worship has been restored for all. We thank God for this. Pray for our work under the leadership of Rev. Khamis Awad Khamis. Pray that the church there may use this opportunity for evangelism and church planting. Pray also for God's work in Dar Fur. They now have Pastors preaching the Gospel among their own people. Here in Juba we have Fur Pastors ministering to their own people in refuge. Praise the Lord!

We have lost contact with our friend Angela Chen from Taiwan. We met her in the States at North Heights Lutheran Church and trust that this letter reaches her and we can communicate again.

We want to thank you again for remembering us and for praying for us.
