At 9 p.m. my family saw me to the gate (that was still allowed at that point), I boarded a plane with two suitcases (and my cat), and I departed for Hungary. **That was 20-years ago!** Had I birthed a child on that day they would be an adult out on their own today and "all grown up". Had I bought a car on that day it would have broken down and I would have replaced it years ago. But shifting into full-time vocational ministry had no such natural progression (or endpoint). It wasn't like climbing the corporate ladder or working toward a raise or a bonus, it wasn't predictable, it wasn't linear, it was good, it was hard, it was humbling. Even after 20-years, I've never felt comfortable calling myself "a missionary". To be honest I never felt that I was "good enough" to be a missionary. **BUT**, I am so grateful that God doesn't depend upon my feelings or my view of myself. God equips us and uses what we give to Him. I fully surrendered and consecrated my life to His purposes 20-years ago and I continue to do so today.

20-years ago I was pretty naive and clueless. I didn't have any idea what living overseas was going to be like. I had no aptitude to learn Hungarian. I was better at tasks and problem solving than I was at building relationships. I was lonely and depressed at times. **Yet God in His grace and in His mercy has used me.** He has taught me, grown me, challenged me, and totally brought me to the end of my understanding and my abilities (Proverbs 3:5-6) - which is a good thing. I know very few specifics of the impact my work has had on people's lives and expanding His Kingdom - but I know in my heart that my work has borne fruit. Over the past 20-years, I have supported hundreds of ministry leaders. I've created systems and processes to make ministry work easier. I moved to Budapest with the call to "use my gifts and skills and training to facilitate and enable the ministry of others." God has allowed me to do this well, and I am grateful.

Many reading this email have given generously and prayed regularly for me through this journey. I have never lacked anything thanks to your faithfulness. You are my partner. You are my hero. You have stood beside me through thick and thin. You have given sacrificially. You have not given up on me when I've been poor at communicating (or late in sending out a thank you card;). Some have read all 126 of these updates. I could not make it through without you.

There is much I could update you on about life and ministry and the things God has been teaching me over the past 6-months, but I am going to leave that to another email. Today I just want to pause and thank God for His faithfulness. ***Thank you from the bottom of my heart!***
