We thank God that we have not received serious cases concerning our widows, only the old age which is associated with many illnesses.

We want to appreciate every one especially the global horizon team for the endless support towards the widows, and to other individuals for supporting the widow's welfare.

Below are the activities which were planned for the month of April.

Prayer and fasting

This had a combination of the board members and the widow's committee for one day. Our prayer points were;

- Good health for our widows
- Low cost of living because there is an increase in the prices of necessities and the widows are vulnerable
- More donor support towards the project
- More widows to accept Christ as their personal savior

BOD meeting for planning

This was meant to review the work plan for the previous month and plan for the new month. We assigned responsibilities to the responsible people and encouraged each other to work towards the planned assignments.

Home visitations

We managed to visit 27 (twenty-seven) homes of the widows purposely for evangelism, health care, and monitoring the IGA project of goats.

We are glad to report that 4 widows received Christ as their Lord and savior. This has encouraged us so much and we plan to monitor them so often.

As usual, some of our widows are often sickly, first aid was administered and others were referred to health centers for further treatment.

Food prices here in Uganda keep on increasing day by day, widows are finding it difficult to afford a meal. Most of them have one meal a day

Monitoring of the goats

The veterinary office together with the social workers moved door to door to the widows who received the goats to deworm and monitor the progress of the goats. 13 goats are so far pregnant and doing well. We pray that this project will be of great help to the widows as they keep on multiplying.

Easter celebrations

We visited the widows in their homes and shared 1 kg of sugar and 1 bar of soap with them as their Easter gifts. We did not manage to do as planned having a meal with them because of the limited finances. We managed to collect some local funds from well-wishers which made us support the widows in that way.

We really appreciate everyone who has been part of this and pray for more provision from God.

Purchase and distribution of Goats

This activity was not done due to funds. We continue to pray for our donors that God may provide for them so that we can be able to support the remaining widows with the goats.

Challenges

- The increasing cost of living is becoming a threat to the widows. Most widows are vulnerable and depend on other people for survival.
- Health of some widows is becoming complicated. We can only afford first aid and any further medication needs money. Some diseases are beyond the health center which we cannot afford.

Planned activities for May 2022

- Prayer and fasting
- Purchase and distribution of goats if funds allow
- BOD & widow's committee meeting for planning
- Home visitations
- Medical care
- Monitoring of the goats
