We thank God for yet another opportunity given unto us to serve in this ministry. 2022 was a year worthy testify on the goodness of the Lord. It is always God's Grace that we are alive and thriving.

And for January, It's been a blessing to all of us, the widows, caretakers, volunteers and the board. We thank God for we are managing to thrive amidst a very dry season here in Uganda

We want to appreciate every one especially the global horizon team for the endless support towards the widows, and to other individuals for supporting the widow's welfare.

Below are the activities which were planned for the month of January.

Prayer and fasting

This had a combination of the board members and the widow's committee for one day. We concentrated on Jeremiah 32:50 and our prayer points were;



- Good health for our widows
- Provision to Basic needs since there is a season of hunger
- More donor support towards the project
- Salvation to more widows.

Board beginning of year planning meeting

This was meant to review last years' activities and work plans, to examine our SWOT and mostly do this year's projections and plans. We again re-assigned responsibilities to the responsible people and encouraged each other to work towards the planned assignments.

Home visitations

We managed to visit 17 (seventeen) homes of the widows purposely for evangelism, health care, and monitoring the IGA project of goats.

We are glad to report that more 2(two) widows received Christ as their Lord and savior. This has encouraged us so much and we plan to monitor them so often.

As usual, some of our widows are often sickly, first aid was administered and others were referred to health centers for further treatment.

We also noticed that since it is dry season, food is getting scarce and coupled with increasing Food prices making widows find it difficult to afford a meal. Most of them have one meal a day.

Purchasing, Distributing and Monitoring of the goats

We were blessed to receive funds to purchase 4 (four) goats from a local well-wisher. We are glad to report that more 4 widows received their goats this January. Also, the veterinary office together with the social workers moved door to door to the widows who received the goats to deworm and monitor the progress of the goats. We still pray and hope that this project will be of great help to the widows as they keep on multiplying.

Christmas with a Widow

Through the local fundraisings, we managed to raise funds to put a smile on widows' faces during last Christmas with food items like sugar, rice, soap, beans and maize flour for their xmas meal.

We really appreciate everyone who has been part of this and pray for more provision from God.

Challenges

- The overwhelming numbers of widows wishing to join the project yet we have limited funding.
- Death, we lost a widow called Annet, aged 93 years. We thank God for her life
- The increasing cost of living is becoming a threat to the widows. Most widows are vulnerable and depend on other people for survival.
- Health of some widows is becoming complicated. We can only afford first aid and any
 further medication needs money. Some diseases are beyond the health center which
 we cannot afford.
- Very poor housing facilities for over 7 widows who are homeless.

Planned activities for February and March 2023

- Prayer and fasting sessions
- Fundraising for 5 homeless widows. We are praying to God for provision.
- Fundraising for more 29 goats as Income Generating activity to widows.
- Purchase and distribution of goats if funds allow.
- Home visitations
- Medical care
- Monitoring of the goats

Conclusion

We pray that God may guide us again as we push forth for the activities of 2023.
