Many of us received gifts at Christmas. I am so thankful that I have received MANY gifts from God this past year.

Our Santisuk English School and churches movement received the gift of new birth. Forty-four percent of our total campers were non-believers who heard personal testimonies from our Thai believers during the Fun and Singing program. Just after English camp two young people made public professions of faith. Some had been in our classes and activities for several years, now they are in our family!





God gave us the gift of 735 students this year in the main campus where I spend most of my time. We talk with these students daily about English, but also about Jesus. Every student that enrolls for a month-long session spends 30 hours with a Christian teacher who shares their life with them while teaching.

God has given me a gift of time to rest, recharge and refresh my body, my relationships, and spirit. I'll be on Philippine Home Assignment from now until April 29, 2025. My goals are to disciple and train Thai believers so they can disciple and train others. I'd still be overseeing the school, teaching, and being part of the pastoral leadership in church.
