Modernity has brought so many things into our lives; the impressive movement is the concentration of people around the cities and towns. From time immemorial, even the Bible asserts that people loved to live together where water and security were guaranteed. This is the case of the ancient Jericho and the development of Jerusalem as a city.

Why do people come to live in the city? It is because there are opportunities; in fact, you find that even when the country is very poor, water, electricity, food, money, etc., are available compared to life in the villages. where a family of 10 people lives in one room of 2/2 m, where the father, the adolescents, and the young ones sleep at night!



Contrary to the growing facilities in the inner cities, in these slums, which are always on the peripheries, life is very hard; the basics are not there, though they are a few miles away, but they do not have the capacity to afford them. What I loved in these places is the spirit of togetherness and hard work. Though there is too much crime, drug abuse, and immorality, the presence of religious movements is beyond understanding. In fact, the many megachurches we have so far originated in such places.
