We have previously shared informal newsletters filled with photos and updates. This new series takes a step back—to reflect on what has worked, what has not, and where we go from here. It draws from our newly completed **five-year strategic plan** and introduces the core of our model:

- Three Pillars of Social Innovation: Continuous Innovation, Value Co-Creation, Cross-Cultural Integration
- Leadership Styles: Relational, Transformational, and Adaptive.

This edition also highlights *Transforming Communities - Leadership in Social Innovation for Sustainable Impact*; Dr. Alfred Bass Sesay's book that anchors FASE's philosophy and tools, and introduces **Maria's story**, a fictional yet relatable narrative of faith-based and community leadership in action.

Global Structure: One Mission, Three Regions

Sierra Leone – Innovation hub for program design, testing and implementation.

U.S. – Drives strategy, funding, and diaspora engagement

U.K. – Connects with academic, faith, and philanthropic partners for funding.

Together, they form a collaborative triangle—aligning resources and relationships while keeping growth rooted in community.

Trying, Listening, Becoming


We're still learning—trying, listening, and Becoming. Some things work, others don't, but each step reveals something new.

FASE's Leadership Framework



The framework developed by our founder, **Dr. Alfred Bass Sesay**, first introduced in his book *Transforming Communities - Leadership in Social Innovation for Sustainable Impact*.

More than theory, this model shapes every program, partnership, and decision. Known as the **Three Pillars of Social Innovation**, it offers a flexible, community-driven approach to leading change with integrity.

- 1. **Continuous Innovation** We learn by doing. Change evolves, and so do we—adapting strategies as challenges arise.
- 2. **Value Co-Creation** We build with communities, not for them. Every initiative is co-designed for relevance, ownership, and impact.
- 3. **Cross-Cultural Integration** We bridge local wisdom with partners and diaspora insight, honoring tradition while embracing innovation.

Leadership in Practice: Guiding Styles at FASE

At FASE, **leadership is not defined by titles, it's defined by presence.** It's found in everyday actions, humble moments, and shared spaces where trust is built, and purpose is lived out. Our approach to leadership grows from the ground up and is shaped by experiences across generations and communities.

Relational Leadership

Rooted in empathy and connection, this style shows up in school committees, family meetings, and across generational lines. Here, leadership begins with listening and grows through mutual respect and meaningful relationships.






Transformational Leadership

Fueled by vision and moral courage, this style emerges when individuals inspire change in others. We see it in youth like Umu mentoring peers, former students returning as teachers, and young leaders stepping into roles they once only observed.

Adaptive Leadership

This style thrives in complexity and crisis. It empowers local leaders to navigate uncertainty, respond in real time, and lead with resilience and resourcefulness in everchanging environments.
