BIBLE STUDY AND FELLOWSHIPS



WIDOWS AND THEIR EXTENDED FAMILY MEMBERS GATHER FOR BIBLE STUDY

As the widows grow older, they need the word of God to draw encouragement and hope. We do this through regular Bible study sessions and fellowships for the widows, providing spiritual nourishment, encouragement, and a sense of community. These gatherings serve as a vital platform for emotional healing and building strong peer support. The testimonies from different believers give hope to the widows and teach them to trust in the lord always as He is the author and finisher of our faith.

GOAT DISTRIBUTION

Great thanks to **Tim And Katherine Bredow**, for supporting the widows' IGA (Income Generating Activity) in this quarter with two

goats. Two widows that is; Mukite Junicky and Scovia Kimanayi were selected and empowered through the distribution of dairy goats to kick-start small-scale goat-rearing businesses. This initiative is designed to promote financial independence and sustainable livelihoods. We are now remaining with 21 widows who have not yet received the goats. We are believing and trusting God for provision for more goats to the remaining widows. Each goat costs 180 dollars

BEDDINGS

We received a generous donation of \$200 to the Kimwanga Widows Project through Donorsee, we were able to purchase beddings for Mary of 74 years one of the widows in our Kimwanga widows project community in Uganda. This gift will make a lasting difference in her live especially in giving her a decent sleeping environment with her grandchildren. Your generosity has not only provided practical help—it has also reminded Mary that someone values her.

Thank you for choosing to stand with widows and help restore dignity and opportunity where it is most needed.

HOME VISITATIONS

We visited three homes of the widows this quarter, a number of them were sick and we went to pray with them, gave preventative care and first aid, the others were on assessment. Home visitations are essential to these widows because they feel loved and they emotionally heal. It is our responsibility to ensure that we visit the widows in their homes to encourage and pray with them.

While on Home visitation, we also use the opportunity to monitor the progress of the income generating Activity (goats) and keep assessing the new need within the widows.

This activity has yielded a lot of hope amongst widows.
