

FLTC: University Students Outreach and New Light House September 2025

Dear friends,

I pray for you all and hope you are feeling blessed by joining with us in Nepal, being the global church.

As a ministry of evangelism, one of our objectives is to plant a house church in Kathmandu with a special focus on the young people. We host a weekly Saturday worship service in our living room to share the love of Christ with university students. On the last Saturday in August, eight students joined us for a 2 hr. service. We do this as a family with my wife, Sabina, and daughter, Genesis, joining in gospel singing and prayer. We read Bible verses and asked the students to respond with their opinion, which was beautiful. I closed in prayer for all youth in general.

In our open conversation, we asked three questions.

- First, name one thing that is positive in the youth culture in our city?
- Second, what is your greatest need?
- This led us to the third question, what is the solution to your need?

Students shared thoughts about friendship, money, careers, and relationships. Sabina and I shared about 'affectionate' love and God's love. We read and discussed verses about God's love in Romans 5:5, John 3:16, and Philippians 2:5.

Impact

- Two brothers have expressed their desire to join the church service on Saturdays and our house fellowship on Wednesdays.
- New relationships are beginning to form.
- The students want to share what they learned with their friends and invite them as well to the next meeting.



New Light House – Buddha and Rebbeca have arrived!

As part of our community outreach, we are partnering with New Light House children's home to assist in their goal to provide children with a loving Christian environment where they learn to love God and love others.

We learned of 2 children in urgent need of care:

- ◆ Buddha (age 12): Buddha lost his father at a young age. His mother is disabled and faces ongoing health challenges, including mental illness, making her unable to care for him any longer.
- ◆ Rebecca (age 6): Rebecca's father is paralyzed, and her mother is his full-time caregiver. With no steady income and no proper home, they depend on the kindness of neighbors for food.

They have both arrived safely! We are so happy to welcome them to their new home. Everyone longs for a home, a refuge, a place to rest and feel safe.



Our goal is to provide Buddha and Rebecca with a safe place to grow, along with their basic needs and access to education. Would you like to help provide essential care?

\$110 per month provides basic needs for one child, which includes:

- a. School fees
- b. Daily food
- c. Clothes
- d. Fruit

We use your gifts to directly fund expenses for Full Life Training Center activities for microbusinesses, education, evangelism activities to share the gospel, and community outreach services.
