ACHIEVEMENTS:

1. READING ALOUD AND SELF CONFIDENCE.

This has been one of the biggest challenges to our children, but as I report now, Our Community children can now speak and read confidently. This has been a result of continuous reading competitions and debating at the library.

2. CHILDREN LEARNING READING IN 100 EASY LESSONS.

This remarkable step-by-step book "TEACH YOUR CHILD TO READ IN 100 EASY LESSONS" has improved our children's decoding and encoding skills in reading and more so in classwork.

3. INCREASE IN NUMBER OF LIBRARY USERS:

The number of library users is so overwhelming; this has been a result of the recent reading conference, which created more awareness among many people in different areas about the library activities.

4. SPORTS AND GAMES ACTIVITIES:

Our children are engaged in different game activities such as Chess, Football, Netball and yearning for more games like Basketball and getting more sports and games equipment.

5. AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMME:

This is a weekend and holiday program at the library engaging Reading, Mathematics and Digital Literacy. It is a success for the community since children embrace it in large numbers and it has improved reading, numeracy and computer use in children.

6. MOTIVATING COMMUNITY CHILDREN:

This was done by giving gift awards to the most library children (users) and best readers. The gifts were in form of clothing donated to the library courtesy of Dr. Joy and team on her recent visit.

7. DEVOTION:

This is done every day before beginning any work by the library team and with children every Wednesday and Saturday. We are also watching religious movies on projectors to nurture a God-fearing community.

In April, 149 children attended our Saturday programs: chess, reading, math, writing, debate and devotions.
